The question language shown below is formatted for the phone interviews. The internet questions were slightly modified to be more appropriate to the medium. Also, some internet survey questions did not have a "not sure" option. All samples are weighted to the same geographic and demographic specifications of a likely 2018 general election voter universe on gender, age, ethnicity (Latino and Asian), party registration and Congressional District. The "200/200" sample is a combination of 200 randomly selected interviews from each sample that was weighted to the same specifications as the other samples.
